The words in italics, from the Advent Hymn, may be sung.

I. (DECEMBER 17) O Wisdom,

You come forth from the mouth of the Most High. You fill the universe and hold all things together in a strong yet gentle manner.

O come to teach us the way of truth.

O come, O come, Thou wisdom from above; the universe sustaining with Thy love.

Thou springest forth from the Almighty's mouth. Subdue us now, and lead us in Thy truth.

Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

2. (DECEMBER 18)
O Adonai and leader of Israel,
You appeared to Moses in a burning bush
and You gave him the law on Sinai.
O come and save us with Your mighty power.

O come, O come, Thou Lord of might, who to Thy tribes on Sinai's height, in ancient times didst give the law in cloud, and majesty and awe:

Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

3. (DECEMBER 19)
O Stock of Jesse,
You stand as a signal for the nations.
Kings fall silent before You whom the peoples acclaim.
O come to deliver us, and do not delay.

O come, Thou rod of Jesse, free thine own from Satan's tyranny; from depths of hell Thy people save, and give them vict'ry o'er the grave:

Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

4. (DECEMBER 20)

O Key of David and sceptre of Israel, what You open, no one can close again; what You close, no one can open.
O come to lead the captive from prison; free those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death.

O come, Thou Key of David, come, and open wide our heav'nly home; make safe the way that leads on high, and close the path to misery:

Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

5. (DECEMBER 21)O Rising Sun,You are the splendour of eternal light and the sun of justice.O come and enlighten those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death.

O come, Thou Day-spring, come and cheer our spirits by Thine advent here; disperse the gloomy clouds of night, and death's dark shadows put to flight:

Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

6. (DECEMBER 22)O King whom all the peoples desire,You are the cornerstone which makes all one.O come and save us whom You made from clay.

O come, Desire of Nations, bind all peoples in one heart and mind. Bid the strife and quarrels cease. Fill all the world with heaven's peace.

Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

7. (DECEMBER 23)
O Immanuel,
You are our King and judge,
the One whom the peoples await, and their Saviour.
O come and save us, Lord, our God.

O come, O come, Immanuel, and ransom captive Israel that mourns in lonely exile here until the Son of God appear:

Rejoice! Rejoice! Immanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.
